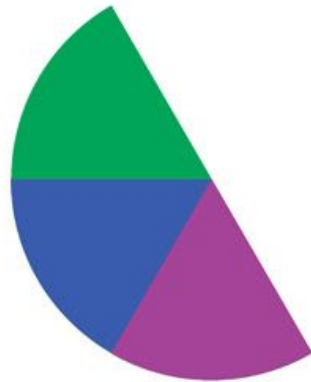

What is a primary colour?

Primary colours are basic colours that can be mixed together to produce other colours. They are RED, YELLOW and BLUE.

What is a secondary colour?

Secondary colours are the result from the mixing of two primary colours. They are GREEN, ORANGE, PURPLE.



Can you identify (spot) the *warm* and the *cool* colours in this drawing? You could look for other warm and cool colours around your house.

***Tonal Colour* is where colour gradually blends from dark to light or light to dark.**

Can you identify the *tonal colour* in this drawing?



Can you identify where the *complementary colours* are?

What is the *effect* of using complementary colours?

You could focus on one of the following:

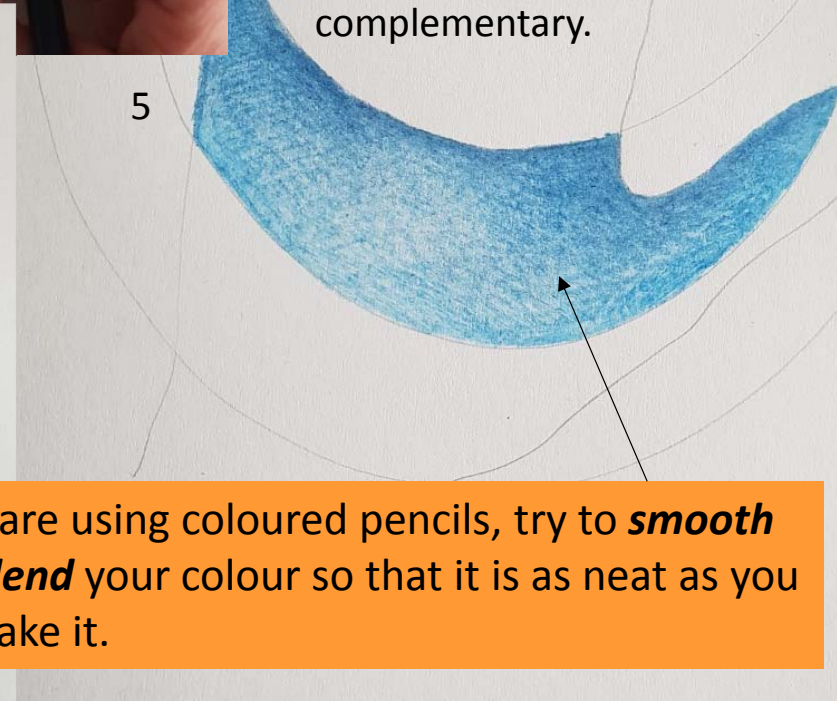
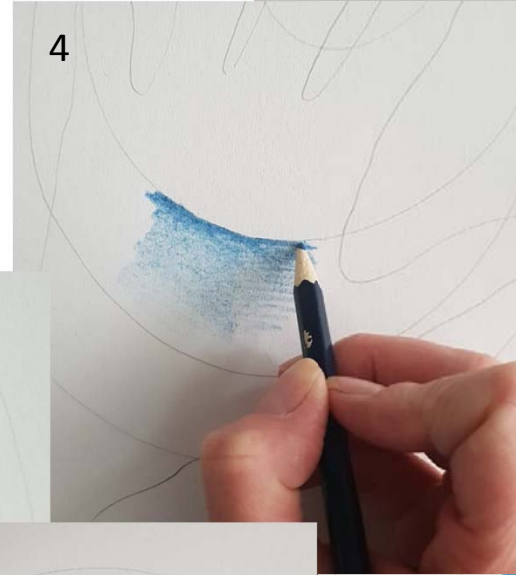
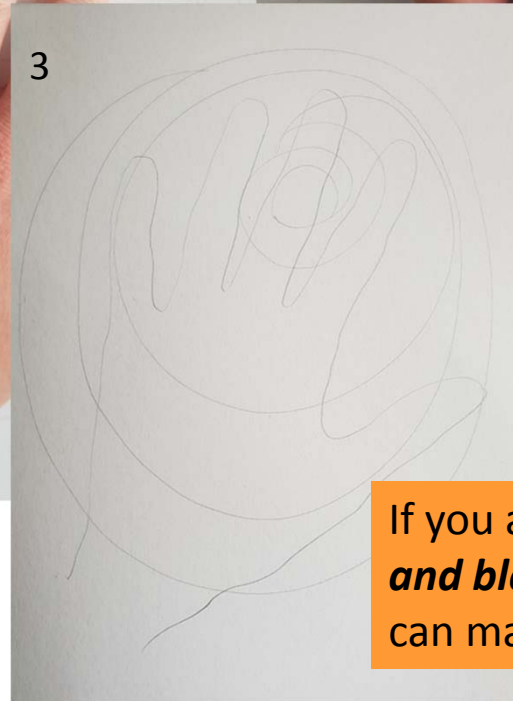
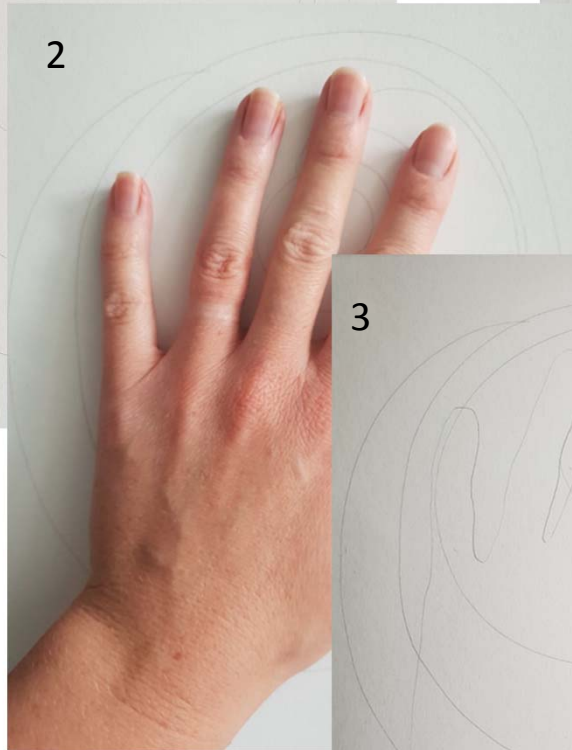
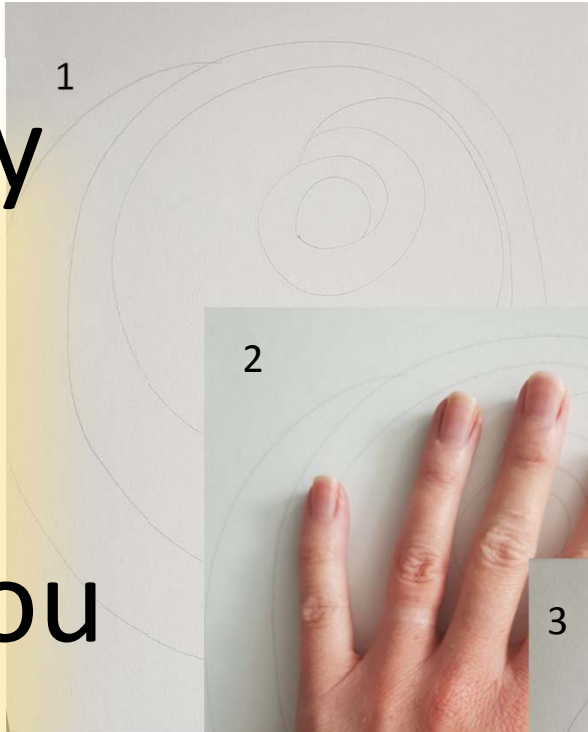
- Primary colour
