Can I remind parents that, as usual, these are compressed days i.e. the students still have 5 shorter lessons whilst lunch and break are combined so that **all students finish at 1.30pm on these days** (if required, students are permitted to remain and work in the dining room for the buses that will run as normal).

#### COVID

Just a reminder of the new temporary national restrictions that have been brought in. These include:

- Face coverings: these are now expected to be worn in all classrooms as well as communal areas (apart from those who are exempt). It would be really appreciated if parents could ensure students are provided with their own face coverings.
- **Isolation:** rules on isolation have now also changed so that, if a child tests positive, they can return to school on day 7 if they have a negative Lateral Flow Test on day 6 and day 7. If these are positive they should continue until 2 days of negative tests or see out the full 10-day isolation.
- Exams: external exams and assessments planned for January will go ahead.
