#### **Curriculum Information**

#### **COVID Changes**

On Wednesday, the Prime Minister announced that all Plan B measures will be removed in England, with a full return to Plan A by Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> January. The DfE have clarified that, in education and childcare settings, this means:

- Since Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> January, face coverings are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff, and pupils and students in Year 7 and above. They were introduced in classrooms at the start of the spring term as a temporary measure.
- From Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> January, face coverings are no longer recommended in communal areas for staff, and pupils and students in Year 7 and above.

This will be the case in school unless local conditions change and we receive further guidance from local public health officials, but staff and students are welcome to continue wearing face coverings should they wish to. The updated parental guide can be accessed here:

# **Onsite Testing**

Next Tuesday (25<sup>th</sup> January) we will have the mobile testing unit visiting the school and hope to be able to provide onsite testing for students in Years 10 and 11 and, depending upon uptake, Year 9. These year groups have been selected as they are our highest number of cases. Communication for this will go out separately.

### Vaccinations

Parents should have received a letter from the School Age Immunisation Team, regarding the offer of a second dose of vaccine for those who wish their child to receive it. We are awaiting confirmation of a date, but I understand they are likely to take place at some point in March.

### **House Badges**

Our House Badge pins have now arrived and this week we started distributing them to students. These badges are small pin badges in the colour of each house and are awarded for each discipline or sport that a student represents their house in. Well done to all who have represented their house. If a student has earned a badge but not yet received it, then they should speak to their Form Sports Captain or Form Tutor. The latest House scores are attached.

Next week, Year 7 will be celebrating Random Acts of Kindness week. Students are encouraged to carry out random kind acts for others students, staff, family or others. Staff will be keen to hear from the students what they have been up to and how such kindness has made them feel.
