Weekly School Focus: Middle Leaders

Over the next couple of weeks, I wanted to give you an insight into the various groups of people that make a school community work, starting with middle leaders. As headteacher I often get the credit (or the blame) for many aspects of school life. One group in particular, the middle leaders, play a particularly key role in driving success and improvement across the school. These are our Heads of Department or Heads of Year.
