## DE LA SALLE SCHOOL PROVIDER ACCESS POLICY

#### Introduction

This policy statement sets out the school's arrangements for managing the access of providers to students at the school for the purpose of giving them information about the provider's education or training offer. This complies with the school's legal obligations under Section 42B of the Education Act 1997 Baker Clause Policy.

#### **Pupil Entitlement**

All students in Years 7 – 11 are entitled to:

- A better understanding of their strengths, achievements and weaknesses and support to evaluate how these might inform future choices in learning and work.
- Find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- Hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events.
- Understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
- Know how to access unbiased, impartial, up-date CEIAG (Careers Education, Information, Advice and Guidance).
- Have opportunities to learn about STEAM related careers (science, technology, engineering, art and maths).
- Direct access to employers, colleges, universities and training providers.
- Impartial guidance to help identify a range of post-16 options and careers advice and support networks that they can use to plan and negotiate their career pathways.
- Have access to range of resources to complete the post-16 application procedures, including CVs, personal statements, and preparation for interviews.
