Whole School Focus: Just say It

Last week, I shared information about how we use form time every morning. One of our weekly activities is something we call '**Just Say It**'. This is something we were keen to introduce to allow our students time and a safe space to talk and explore topics and themes. It is also an opportunity to help them improve the skills and manner in which they communicate and to address issues of inappropriate or discriminatory language.

The idea is very simple, as part of extended form work each week, there will be one day that we ask students to quickly move their room around and create a circle. They then have time to discuss a topic. The discussion point can be thought of by them, or they could use one of the examples that we provide. We are a community here, and it is important to us that we develop strong relationships with one another, so we need to learn about each other! Some questions/ statements/topics of discussion will challenge them and that is okay, the students are each entitled to their own opinions and views so...JUST SAY IT!
