

# What do I use to revise science?

# **BBC** bitesize

- Choose GCSE-AQA-trilogy (for combined science) or AQA Biology/Chemistry/Physics for triple award.
- Bitesize is conveniently arranged into the same topics we deliver. You can therefore just focus on your weakest topics.
- Revision notes/videos & Quiz that are marked available for each topic.

# GCSE Pod & Oak academy


- Free & accessible from anywhere

- YOU WILL GET AN EXAM TIMETABLE AND YOU SHOULD PLAN
  YOUR REVISION SCHEDULE WEEKS BEFORE TO GIVE ENOUGH
  TIME TO ALL YOUR SUBJECTS.
- MAKE SURE YOU ORGANISE ALL EQUIPMENT NEEDED-RULER, CALCULATOR, SPARE PENS, ETC. KNOW YOUR LOCATION AND SEAT NUMBER!!
- AND FINALLY SLEEP/HYDRATION/EXERCISE & A GOOD DIET ARE ALL ESSENTIAL PREPARATION TOO.

#### SAMPLE ASSESSMENT MATERIALS

- THEY SHOW THE STYLE OF QUESTIONS YOU WILL BE ANSWERING AND ARE A GOOD WAY OF PRACTICING YOUR TIMING TOO.
- IT IS VITAL YOU ALSO LOOK AT THE MARK SCHEMES TO SEE HOW MARKS

  ARE AWARDED AND THE TERMINOLOGY REQUIRED FOR EACH MARK.
- YOU WILL START TO UNDERSTAND WHY MARKS WERE NOT AWARDED
   AND WHAT THE EXAMINERS ARE LOOKING FOR. THEY CAN BE ACCESSED
   VIA THE AQA WEBSITE.

#### **DURING THE EXAM**

- TIME MANAGEMENT-THIS IS VITAL.
- HOPEFULLY YOU WILL HAVE PRACTICED SOME FULL PAST PAPERS BEFOREHAND.
- TRY TO STICK TO ONE MINUTE PER MARK AS A ROUGH GUIDE. SOME QUESTIONS WILL REQUIRE MORE TIME THAN OTHERS FOR EXAMPLE DOING CALCULATIONS.
- FIND TIME TO ANSWERS ALL QUESTIONS IN THE PAPER. THE NEW GCSE'S HAVE LARGE
  STRUCTURED QUESTIONS WITH MANY SECTIONS A,B,C,D,E,F ETC STARTING WITH LOW
  DEMAND AT THE BEGINNING AND GETTING PROGRESSIVELY MORE DIFFICULT
  TOWARDS THE END OF THE QUESTION.
- THIS IS SO ALL PUPILS CAN ATTEMPT THE A,B, AND C SECTIONS WITH LESS PUPILS
  BEING ABLE TO COMPLETE THE FULL RANGE.



- IF YOU GET STUCK ON A HARDER PART IT IS BEST TO MOVE ON TO THE NEXT QUESTION AND MAYBE RE-VISIT IT LATER ON RATHER THAN WASTING TOO MUCH TIME ON ONE SECTION.
- FINALLY YOU CAN ONLY SCORE ZERO ON A QUESTION IF YOU WRITE NOTHING
   SO HAVE AN EDUCATED GUESS IF YOU REALLY DO NOT KNOW.
- SHOW YOUR WORKING-IF YOU LOOK AT THE MARK SCHEMES YOU WILL SEE

  EXAMINERS AWARD MARKS FOR ERRORS CARRIED FORWARD (ECF). SO IF DOING
  A CALCULATION FOR EXAMPLE WRITE DOWN ALL YOUR WORKING OUT!
- CHECK YOUR ANSWERS-DOES IT MAKE SENSE? HAVE YOU ACTUALLY ANSWERED
  THE QUESTION? IS IT READABLE? ARE KEY WORDS SPELT CORRECTLY? HAVE YOU
  ADDED THE UNITS?

#### How do I revise for English Language?

- Practise! Start now. Make a revision timetable and keep it going past mocks.
- Attempt past papers see MS TEAMS, your class teacher, AQA website
- Attempt past questions under timed conditions. Don't try to do too much too soon –
  work on a question at a time but make sure you don't spend 30 mins tackling a question
  you would only have 10 mins to answer in the exam!
- Read, read! This will really help with your preparation for LP1. Short stories would be fine. Parents – could you read alongside your child and then discuss the text afterwards? Ask them about the language used, why characters behave in the way that they do and what your child's opinion is of the text – these questions link to what your child has to analyse in the exam.
- Watch documentaries, especially to help your preparation with LP2. Parents could you
  watch the same documentaries and discuss them afterwards? Netflix and Youtube can
  be good places to start. Professor Green and Stacey Dooley have recently produced
  fairly engaging ones looking at modern day poverty in the UK.

#### How do I revise English Language?



- Make use of Mr Bruff a video for every question on both language papers, including exemplar material. Parents – ask your child to talk you through what Mr Bruff is saying. Teaching material to somebody else is proven to be an effective way of embedding knowledge into the long term memory.
- Pre-prepare for LP1 Q5 a character you can 'drop' into an image or narrative, five wow words you can spell and use in context, varying your sentences making use of ISPACE, sticking to the flashback/cyclical structure model.
- Make use of exemplar material and the mark scheme. Plenty of this online, including on Mr Bruff's website and on the AQA website or ask your teacher for examples.

#### How do I revise for English Literature?



- Know your set texts. Re-read them—free copies on Show My
  Homework/online or see your class teacher. Watch the DVDs again —
  most are free on Youtube. Family film night......?
- Make use of revision guides available via Parentmail
- FlipCoCards or create your own
- Five a day knowledge recap questions. Available on Show My Homework
- Mr Bruff and Stacey Reay have free online videos to support every text you study for English Literature. Plenty of exemplar responses deconstructed too so make use of them!

#### How do I revise for English Literature?



- Facebook GCSE revision page.
- DLS Instagram and Twitter
- Look at the past questions and sample questions for your set texts.
   Attempt the worst case scenario questions and bring to Mrs Marks for feedback
- Make sure you know which poems from the power and conflict cluster can be used for various questions
- Parents could you re-read the set texts alongside your child? Or cheat and familiarise yourself on characters and plot by making use of Wikipedia or Sparknotes?! Make time each day/week to discuss the plot/themes/characters/context. Ask your child to teach you difficult parts of the text to really ensure they have the knowledge of it.

#### How to revise

Identify your weakest areas and target these first

Work in short and meaningful blocks – your brain will switch off if you try to cram. 20-25 mins and then a break Revision MUST be an active process. Find what works for you but don't passively read notes as the information will not stick. Make:

- Mind-maps then cover over and recreate from memory
- Flash cards ones with key info on one side and key questions to check understanding on the other tend to work best
- Say it out loud or sing it! Check out Mr Bruff's songs for the key texts. They work!
- Quote quizzes who said this? Quotes with missing words you have to fill in
- Repeat material you have already revised you have to make it stick. Come back to it later that week, the week later, later that month
- Teach it to someone else to the point that they could write a response. Proven to be more effective than any other technique.

Parents – can you become quizmasters for the next few months to assess your child's knowledge? 5 quick fire questions each day could really help to secure key information to the long term memory. You never know, it may even come up at a pub quiz for you in the future!

#### Top 5 revision tips:

- Learn Key terms. If you don't know the key terms, then you may not be able to access the question
- Use online platforms to help even if it is just a twenty minute activity
- Create a revision clock and focus on an hour at a time
- Cross match SOWA's across topics! For example "Let there be light" could be used in the Creation topic in 1.3 (Paper 1) but also topic 1.6 Cosmological argument (Paper 3)
- ➤ REST!!!
