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#### Parental Update 6

There are many highs and lows being headteacher and last night was definitely one of the biggest highs I can recall at our Open Evening. It was by far the busiest I and others can recall, which is great for the school. More important than that though, and where my deep feeling of pride came from, was the comments of the visiting parents and children about how warm and welcoming the staff were and, even more powerfully, how kind, passionate, polite and lovely the students were. A big thank you to all who supported it, and especially existing parents who came along.

### Whole School Focus: Reports and Information

I thought it might be useful to clarify for all parents what information they should expect to receive from the school and when this will be (see attached table for dates).

- **Information Evening:** these were trialled this year for all year groups to set out what the year looks like for each year group, where to access curriculum information and sharing year-specific information.
- **Monitoring Report:** these are a brief data summary of where your child is up to in each subject (Years 7-10 will receive 2 of these each year, and Year 11 1 of these)
- **Full Report:** These are the detailed reports with written comments from your child's teacher (all years will receive 1 of these each year)
- **Pastoral Parents' Meeting**: these are relatively short meetings between parents and their form teacher (these are for Yrs 7-10). These are online.
- Full Parents' Evening: these are longer events where parents can meet with each of their child's subject teachers. We are looking at which of these will be in person and which will be online – tbc.

# College and 6<sup>th</sup> Form Open Evenings

For Parents of students in Years 10 and 11 I have attached a copy of all the college and 6<sup>th</sup> form open evenings for the local area. Most of the colleges do come in and speak to the students, but you may want to visit them yourself to help decide your child's next steps.

### **Mobile Phones**

Our strict approach to mobile phones remains very effective, with incidents now in single figures, which is great. Can I remind parents, however, that any child who is caught with a phone twice in the week, or doesn't initially hand it over, will need to have it collected by their parent after school, up to 4:00pm.
