Parental Update 15

I hope that you and your family had a restful, happy and holy Christmas and wish you all a happy New Year. The start of term has been a good one, though weather related delays pre-Christmas meant our building work has pushed its completion back a week (see later). More generally, staff and students have returned in positive mood with uniform and attendance being much improved on the end of last term (though acrylic nails have been an issue for some students).

Looking ahead to the upcoming term, it is quite a packed schedule of events including Year 11 mock interviews, Year 11 and Year 9 Parents' evenings, our Ski Trip, Year 7 and Year 9 assessments, the final set of Year 11 mock exams, several governor meetings and our Presentation Evening (please see Forthcoming Events below for dates/times of these events).

Whole School Focus: Attendance

I am sure some of you will be getting 'attendance message fatigue' as we keep you updated on your child's attendance. I hope you understand that we are quite rightly expected to put great emphasis on attendance and I know some parents have raised questions such as "what about the part days for Parents' Evenings etc or for trips and other events?"

This is a fair question and of course, the least amount of time missed from school is the aim for all of us. With regards to early closures e.g. for Parents' Evenings, these are already factored into our curriculum planning, and in many cases, we still operate a 5-lesson day, just compressed and combining break/lunch so that only small amounts of time are lost for each subject. This minimises any impact upon student learning.

In contrast to this, an individual student absence will mean they miss the learning that other students are getting and, inevitably, need to catch-up outside of the lesson or risk falling behind. The impact of absence was felt very starkly, mostly as a COVID impact, in the summer with our GCSE results. The table below shows the attendance levels of our outgoing Year 11 students over the previous 2 pandemic years based upon their progress in the GCSEs.

Progress	Avg. Attendance 2021/22	Avg. Attendance 2020/21
2+ grades below expected	75%	87%
1+ grades below expected	82%	87%
Making Negative progress	85%	90%
Positive Progress	91%	94%
1+grades above expected	94%	97%

This makes the very stark link between attendance at school and progress in exams – those below 90% attendance for those 2 years making less progress than expected whilst those with 91%+ making above expected progress. This is why we make no apology for the high-profile push for attendance this year – it really does matter.

You can perform miracles by touching the hearts of those entrusted to your care.

Parents' Evenings

The Parents' Evening season is approaching. Having listened to parental feedback, we have taken the decision to hold these in-person once again, whilst the pastoral meetings (with form teachers) will remain online. Details of the upcoming Year 11 and Year 9 meetings are below and information regarding bookings has already been sent out.

Homework Hackers – Parental Support Courses

St Helens Chamber of Commerce have launched a new training programme called "Homework Hackers" which will help parents get the skills they need in Maths and IT to help their children with homework.

Anyone aged 19+ living in the Liverpool City Region can access this course free, and learners can choose from 6 modules in either IT or Maths based on what they need.
