Parental Update 16

Our first full week of 2023 has continued in positive fashion with our attendance continuing to rise, standards of uniform being strong, our first face to face parents' evening since 2020 which was very positive and well attended and, during her visit, our School Improvement Partner, who regularly visits dozens of schools, not only recognising the improvements to teaching and learning but commenting on how calm the school was and that our students' behaviour in lessons and during social time was exemplary.

This week also saw the North West Lasallian Educators Gathering (see later), parental meeting for the Iceland trip, flu vaccinations, Duke of Edinburgh (Year 10) parental meeting as well as footballing success. Whilst looking ahead to next week, we have Year 11 mock interviews, our Year 9 Parents' Evening, our Year 7 Harry Potter House Quiz and our Ski Trip sets off to Andorra.

Whole School Focus: Sacrament of Confirmation

The Catholic Church has seven sacraments: Baptism, Reconciliation, Communion, Confirmation, Marriage, Holy Orders and Anointing of the Sick. These sacraments mark key points in an individual's journey deeper into the Catholic Faith.

The Sacrament of Confirmation is the sacrament where we receive the Holy Spirit and grow closer in our relationship with God. This is often seen as the moment that a young person confirms their faith. In our Archdiocese, it is currently offered to young people in Year 8 and above.

I am sure many of you recall being confirmed whilst in secondary school. For a long period, the work and preparation for this was done in secondary schools. Arrangements for Confirmation were changed and the organisation was taken on by the Archdiocese. Now things have changed again and it is delivered as a partnership between schools and the Archdiocese.

The attached letter provides details of how the process will work for those who wish to continue their journey in the Catholic faith, and receive the sacrament.

Please take the time to read the attached information then, if your child is in Year 8 or above, you can register your child for the sacrament at <u>https://liverpoolcalled.co.uk/</u> registration must take place before the **17th March**.

Re: Sacrament of Confirmation

Dear parent/guardian,

The archdiocese of Liverpool is inviting young people in year 8 (and above) to the sacrament of confirmation.

Confirmation is a sacrament through which we receive the Holy Spirit to make us stronger and more perfect Christians and true witnesses of Jesus Christ.

The preparation for the sacrament will begin in school with an introduction to the sacrament from Animate, the archdiocesan youth ministry team.

Alternatively your child may be asked to watch four short introductory videos at <u>https://www.youtube.com/user/AnimateYouth</u> Playlist - 'Confirmation Called ...'.

Year 8 pupils will then study the subject of confirmation in their RE classes.

After the registration deadline has passed your child will be invited to preparation sessions in your local area (parish / deanery).

Following these local preparation times young people will be invited to be confirmed.

If your child would like to receive the sacrament of confirmation this year it is <u>essential</u> they register online at:

Registration must take place before the <u>17th March.</u>

Please complete the form that can be accessed through clicking the button at the top right-hand side of the webpage ('Register for Confirmation'). If you are unable to do this at home please inform the school chaplain who will be able to help.

When a young person has registered they will be contacted by your local confirmation co-ordinator who will take you through the next steps of the preparation process.

Dear Parent/Carer,

RE: Relationship, Sex and Health Education (RHSE) at De La Salle

Government guidelines outline that, from the age of 11, it is compulsory for all schools to provide an RHSE curriculum.

At our school, we believe that it is important to provide our students with a thorough and balanced curriculum, including age-appropriate information about sex and relationships.

The details of what will be taught to the various year groups is detailed in the school's RSE and Health Education Policy, which can be accessed on our <u>school website</u>, or in hard copy via our school office.

Though schools must provide RHSE for students from the age of 11, up until the age of 19, only aspects of the science national curriculum are compulsory for students to learn. Therefore, as parents, you are entitled to request that your child be removed from sex education lessons up to and until three terms before they turn 16-years-old. After that point, if your child wishes to receive sex education, the school will make arrangements to provide them with sex education during one of those terms.

Requests for withdrawal should be submitted in writing to myself, the Headteacher, who will discuss this with you and your child's teacher, and determine an appropriate substitute for these lessons. In most instances, children will be provided with self-directed reading or exercises which they can complete under the supervision of a trainee teacher.

It is important to note that we will always highlight any Catholic teachings as appropriate throughout the curriculum to ensure our students are aware of a range of viewpoints.

If you have any concerns or queries about your child's participation in these lessons, please do not hesitate to contact either myself or your child's class teacher to discuss these.
