Parental Update 2

I must start with a massive thank you to you all for ensuring the students' uniform was up to the high standards we have in place this year. Based upon experiences shared by other schools, we had set up the Activity Studio with 40 chairs to accommodate those students refusing to comply but, owing to your support, this wasn't necessary as we have only had low single figures reducing across the week.

This, alongside our focus upon being punctual to lessons, really has had a much wider impact upon student attitudes within school and making it an even calmer and happier place to be. So again, thank you for your part in that, we all just need to keep on top of it.

Whole School Focus - Form Time

We start every day with 30 minutes of form time. This time is spent as a form class with a range of activities each morning. In addition to daily business, registration, uniform checks and collective worship, across the 5 days the students will have:

- **Assembly** (as a whole year group)
- **Extended Collective Worship**: the students engage with a theme and resources provided by Sam our Chaplain, and now have prayer journals to capture their own thoughts and reflections.
- **Reading**: one morning a week is dedicated to form classes reading collectively. This can be an ongoing novel, article or short story and is supported by discussion of the text.
- 'Just Say It': this is a circle time activity for the class to discuss a topic that they are provided with by our Team Reims students.
- **News and Careers**: students will watch a relevant clip from Newsround, take part in our weekly news quiz and/or cover aspects of careers

Open Evening

Our Open Evening is taking place on **Thursday 5th October**. We are always aware that there is a lot of great choice out there for secondary schools and so it is important that we show a positive, but accurate, picture of our school to prospective parents. To help ensure the building is ready, **students will be finishing school at 1.10pm** (packed lunches will be available for students on FSM).

The evening starts from 4.30pm and closes at 7.30pm. I will be speaking at 4.45pm, 5.45pm and 6.45pm.

Information Evenings (Message from Mrs Greensmith)

Your child's academic progress and success is extremely important to us and we would like to work together, in partnership with you, to support them by helping them to develop their ability to study independently. Strengthening their revision and study skills will help them reach their full potential and reduce the anxiety some pupils experience when studying for exams.

To achieve this, we are holding 2 parental support evenings;

- Year 8 and Year 9 on Wednesday 20th September 5.30-7.00
- Year 10 and Year 11 on Thursday 28th September 5.30-7.00

As mentioned last week, Year 7 have had an initial information evening last July and we will look to provide further support for our new Year 7 pupils later in the year once they have had more time to settle into their new school.

These events have been specially designed to offer you advice and information about how you can support your child to revise and independently study at home. The evening will be an informal event where you can talk to members of staff, ask questions and learn how you can work with your child so that you can better support them in the preparation for exams.

Upon arrival we will give you a brief overview of how educational research shows revision works best for pupils before you visit the different workshops with demonstrations by staff on a variety of different ways to revise and have an opportunity to try out some of the revision techniques that each subject recommends. We would encourage you to bring your child with you to the event so that they feel part of this support process.

750 Bus Overcrowding

Merseytravel have asked us to raise the issue of overcrowding on the 750 bus after school. They are looking into this service but have asked us to ask students and parents to consider taking one of the other buses (751, 752, 753) which all follow parts of the same route (I have attached the bus route list to help you).

Industrial Action (NASUWT)

Just when we hoped that any disruption to school life was over, the NASUWT has notified schools nationally that they and their members are taking further industrial action. Fortunately, this is 'Action Short of Strike Action' rather than full strike action. This means that, from Monday, members of the union will refuse to undertake certain additional activities outside of school times. This action is national and not against our school specifically, and is in protest over 'the failure of the government to fully fund the pay award and resolve the excessive workload and long hours for teachers.'

We don't routinely ask staff to do any of the areas covered, so the impact should be minimal but it may result in some staff or departments not being represented at additional events such as the Information Evenings. Please be assured that Parents' Evenings are not affected.

And finally...The Scrapbook

When we asked, Dad explained, in all seriousness, that the photo had been lost years ago but he had stuck the holder in anyway. Hard to believe my dad had quite an important job when he was younger!




