Parental Update 31

The first week back after half term has seen the Year 11 GCSEs continue, our Year 10 mocks slotted in between the main GCSEs and our Year 8 students begin their assessment fortnight. Meanwhile, as I said, I have been away at the Lasallian Mission Council meeting in Madrid (see later) which explains the shorter than normal update.

Looking ahead to next week, we begin a series of careers events under the umbrella of 'Discovering Careers' – these will run over a couple of weeks. We also have our Governors' Personnel Committee meeting and the SLT Strategic Planning event.

I have also updated the upcoming events through to our Mission Week. Please note that this year, the early finish for our Founders week is on Friday 21st June rather than Founders Day itself. Please also note the INSET day on Monday 24th June, when school is closed to students for staff development.

Whole School Focus - Bus Strike

We have been asked to share the following information with parents about upcoming industrial action that affects the bus services for our school.

As you may be aware, drivers at Stagecoach's Gillmoss Depot have voted to carry out industrial action on the following days **13,14,15,16 & 17**th **June.** This will mean there will be disruption to Stagecoach services across the Liverpool, Sefton, Knowsley and St Helens areas.

Unfortunately, this will mean that the supported services for your school currently operated by Stagecoach will not be running on these strike days. We would advise that school pupils who use these services should look for alternative means of transport to and from school on these days.

We ask that you share this with parents and pupils. We understand discussions remain ongoing to avoid the strike action, but we advise that schools, parents and pupils should seek regular updates from the Stagecoach website and Stagecoach Merseyside and South Lancashire social media Channels for further information, consult the Merseytravel website for alternative transport options, and look to make any necessary travel arrangements on the affected strike days.

Mission Council Meeting (Madrid)

As you will know, the Lasallian Institute is a worldwide organisation of over 1 million children, thousands of schools, colleges and universities. To help run such a large organisation it is divided

into regions (ours being RELEM: Europe and the Mediterranean). Then each Region is divided into Districts (ours being GB, Ireland and Malta).

One of my roles is to be the GB headteacher representative on our District's Mission Council – this is the group that plans and implements the district's Mission Plans. The past 2 days has seen us meeting with our ARLEP (District of Spain and Portugal) counterparts. The purpose of this has been manifold:

- To learn from their system and structures (they are a far more established District)
- To begin the process of bringing the 2 districts together, as a first step to a single European District
- To hold our own summer meeting to review where we are up to and to plan for the year ahead.

I am writing this update in snatched moments between sessions as it is fairly full on: starting around 7.30am each morning and then running through to 6.30pm before then also gathering for meals together. It has been a very interesting and steep learning experience so far.



Durham, LSE and Warwick have joined Imperial and Cambridge to incorporate the Test of Mathematics for University Admission (TMUA) into their selection process for 2025 entry. The world-class, research-intensive institutions will be using the TMUA to select students for a number of Maths and Statistics-based courses, as well as some in Economics, Computer and Data Science. The TMUA is one of two computer-based assessments that will be delivered by University Admissions Tests-UK (UAT-UK) for 2025 entry.

Long-awaited plans to award <u>UCAS points to apprenticeships have been revealed by the university admissions body</u>. From this September, people completing level 3 apprenticeships could be awarded up to 112 UCAS points to apply to universities, depending on the length of their apprenticeship. This is great news as it means you can do a Level 3 Apprenticeship at the end of Year 11 and still go onto university.
