### Parental Update 33

The GCSEs are now officially done, and we wish our outgoing Year 11 students a restful summer break ahead of their GCSE results in August. Meanwhile in school, there is no let up as we had two big Year 7 Geography trips taking place, the Year 10 Mocks continued, a range of formation activities for staff and students, Governors meeting and last night's wonderful GCSE Art, Photography and Graphics exhibition (a big thank you to the staff and parents that attended this).

Next week is a very special week, as it is Mission Week with a range of activities and events, culminating in Thursday's Founder's Day (see below). In addition, we start the week with an INSET Day, have vaccinations for Year 9, two Carmel College visits for Year 10 Students, another Governor meeting, and SVP Conference and our Blackpool Rewards trip – with over 700 students taking part.

#### Whole School Focus - Mission Week

Next week sees us celebrate Mission Week. This is a week of lessons, activities and events to remind us of our Founder, St John Baptist de la Salle and how we live out his educational mission. The week actually starts today, with our staff coming together this afternoon to review and take part in joint planning around how we deliver Catholic Social Teaching. This is an important part of our holistic development of our students, to help them see how they can contribute to a kinder and fairer society.

**Monday:** INSET Day which will follow some of the themes above, whilst also allowing our departments to review and re-plan their schemes of work, assessments and curriculum based upon the previous year.

**Tuesday:** is Touching Hearts Day where students will follow their normal timetables, but each department has worked to create specific lessons within their subject area, that provide a link to our Catholic Social Teaching and our Mission statement

**Wednesday**: Lasallian Awards Day: this day will be dedicated to each year group coming together to celebrate their achievements and to recognise those students who have gone above and beyond in their efforts and support of our Lasallian Mission.

**Thursday**: One Lasalle: This is our Founder's Day and Culture Day. This is the big celebration with the students taking part in a range of tutorials and special sessions led by staff, students and visitors which celebrate the many cultures that make up our school community. Students will also attend mass with their year group and then finish the afternoon by visiting 4 different zones – each packed with entertainment, activities and displays.

**Friday**: School rewards trip to Blackpool and events and activities within school for those not attending.

It is an incredibly ambitious and exciting week of events for which we will keep our fingers crossed that the weather holds and all have a great time.

#### **School Uniform**

- PE kit should only be our school branded kit, no other brands will be permitted (see separate PE kit and the PE Kit note below)
- School operates a quality seconds uniform store, please contact Mrs Shepherd if interested.

#### **Beat the Students**

#### **PE Kit Changes**

Parents should have recently received a ParentMail outlining upcoming changes we are making to our PE kits for students. 
