Tips to Learning Lines

- Read the lines aloud. By speaking the lines you will hear them and they are more likely to stick.
- Ask a friend to help you. Friends can correct you on any mistakes you make, give you the cue lines and go back over any weak areas.
- There are several apps which can help with learning lines. <u>Line Learner</u> you record all the lines including those of other characters and then listen to them leaving silent pauses to speak your own lines. With <u>Rehearsal Pro</u> you can upload a script and watch it scrolling by as you record your lines to listen to.

How to break down an exam question

CUE- The first thing you should do when reading the question

C- Circle the command word U-Underline the key words

E- Extend words that have more than one element
