Parental Update 10

We also had final confirmation from the DfE that we will acdemise on 1st December.

Looking ahead to next week, we have a review of our SEND provision, a Year 10 and 11 English trip to the theatre, will hold our annual 'Your Future' Careers event for Years 9, 10 and 11 and our GCSE Awards evening.

Whole School Focus - Remembrance Service

November always feels a very sombre month with the feasts of All Saints, All Souls and then Remembrance Day, and it was in a pensive and sombre mood that, as a school, we took time on Monday to come together to remember those who have given their lives for our country. This year, our chaplaincy team were keen to have everyone feel involved, so we also encouraged staff and students to share the names of family and friends, who may have recently passed, and who they would like us to remember.

It was a beautiful service, which was held on the bridge across the courtyard, with classes joining in the inner courtyard or from their classrooms. I was joined on the bridge by a number of our students who are part of various uniformed groups: cadets, scouts, guides etc.

Amber, in year 8, began the service with a short prayer:

History can inspire or trap. Walls can protect or divide. Words can encourage or inflame. Power can free or destroy. Touch can comfort or violate. Peace can be shared or withheld Loving God, on this day, when we remember past and present conflicts, we pray for the divided peoples of the world, that leaders, governments and each one of us may use our resources, our opportunities and our lives in the service of reconciliation. for the sake of future generations and to the glory of your name. I then read the poem, For the Fallen, then Mr McIntyre played the Last Post to mark the start of our 2-minute silence, during which our uniformed students stood to attention, our students observed

the silence impeccably, and a poppy wreath containing all the names put forward by our community, was raised.

At the end, Mr McIntyre played the Reveille which brought the service to a close. A very special and moving moment for the whole school.

ONE OF OUR YEAR 7 FORM CLASSES AT MASS IN ST TERESA OF AVILA

When it comes to making decisions, hosting events or planning projects, our Gospel values and prayer are always central to the things we do as a Catholic Life team. Prayer has been a big theme for us this week as Chaplaincy led year group Prayer and Liturgy, we hosted our monthly Day of Prayer for staff and students and we took a Year 7 form class to Mass with us in St Teresa of Avila.

This Week

As a school community, there are a number of times throughout the year that we have the opportunity to gather for the celebration of Mass. Pre-Covid our school Chapel was host to weekly community Mass, a time for staff and students to be joined by members of our local community with Mass celebrated by Fr, now Bishop, Tom Neylon. With Tom being moved on from St Helens and the huge impacts of Covid, community Mass has not been something that we've been able to reestablish. We do believe that the weekly time of Mass and the opportunity to meet and mix with local parishioners is super important. After consideration and time of prayer we decided that it would be a good idea to get ourselves into our local church to keep that connection alive!

We now take classes from Year 7 and 8 for weekday Mass in St Teresa of Avila with Fr Martin Kershaw (who many of our students already know through their primary school). A huge thank you to Mr Ingham this week for the way he supported Chaplaincy in getting his form class to church!

HOPE 2024 (Repeated information)

We have launched our *Hope 2024* campaign again. This is a project we promote each year and as people of hope we aim to Help Other People Eat (HOPE). This year, we're asking form classes to collect £24. They can decide together if this money will contribute to our Mary's Meals collection or if it will be donated to our own school food pantry to support with our Christmas parcels for families in need. Either option will hugely support important projects.

Although we're going for a coin collection to support these two projects we will, of course, be extremely grateful for any donations of food for our pantry. Please consider if you're able to support in any way, it will be warmly received.

Opportunities

As explained last week, our prayer theme this week was *The Earth You Created*. We encouraged our students to consider themselves as part of creation, and suggested that to get themselves in the right position to do good for the world, they should also look at how they're treating themselves as part of creation. How do they take opportunities to nourish themselves spiritually, emotionally, physically and academically. As Catholic life there are a number of dates in our diary that we shared with students! Information will be sent out to relevant year groups over the next week or so!

Prayer and Liturgy

On Tuesday 19th, a number of members of staff will attend a Prayer and Liturgy Launch event. This is a day designed to celebrate a new-ish document called the *Prayer and Liturgy Directory: To Love You More Dearly.* This document guides us as we plan and prepare our pattern of prayer here in school. In a typical week students have access to Form Class Mass, Year Group Prayer and Liturgy, and daily Form Time Prayer and Liturgy. In each of these spaces students have a variety of prayer styles to explore, from meditation and silence, to discussion and open prayer. We also have monthly Days of Prayer where students can gather to pray and have tea and toast together in Chapel.

Our Next Theme

Next week is the 33rd week of Ordinary time. At this time of year we use the colour green within our displays and materials produced for times of prayer and liturgy. This colour is symbolic of growth and freshness. We use green to represent that our understanding of scripture, and our hope is always new, developing and fresh within our community.

The theme of our prayer and liturgy will be; *Judgement* as we focus on the International Day of the Child. We're called by God to become more like little children in our lives and so we're inspired by the young people around us. Year Teams will be leading us in our weekly Prayer and Liturgy, and we will be exploring the words from Mark 13:24-32
