Whole School Focus - Knife Crime

The shocking news this week of the tragic events at All Saints school in Sheffield, are a stark reminder to us all of the dangers and risks of knife crime. Our hearts go out to the families of both children involved and the staff and students at the school, which was once part of the Lasallian family of schools.

I completely understand that many of you may be feeling anxious about safety in schools, but it is important to remember that though knife crime is a growing concern within society, such incidences still remain exceptionally rare within schools. Nevertheless, it is important that schools remain vigilant and well prepared should the unthinkable happen.

Please be assured that the wellbeing of our students remains our highest priority, and we are committed to maintaining a safe, caring, and supportive environment for all. From an external point of view, we are fortunate that our school site, compared to most schools, is well protected with two red lines of security and largely encircled by houses.

Within school, we have strong safeguarding policies in place, including close supervision, clear behavioural expectations, and ongoing collaboration with the local authority and other agencies to ensure the safety of our students. We also actively promote respect, kindness, and conflict resolution through our pastoral care programs.

As part of our ongoing commitment to safety, we remain vigilant and having just reviewed our lockdown policy will be testing our in-school lockdown procedures in the coming weeks. These drills help to ensure that staff and students are well-prepared in the unlikely event of an emergency.

We encourage you to have open conversations with your children about making safe and positive choices, looking out for one another, and speaking to a trusted adult if they ever feel concerned. If

you would like support in discussing these topics at home, or if you have any concerns, please don't hesitate to reach out to us.

Together, as a community, we can continue to foster a secure and nurturing environment where every student and member of staff feels safe, valued, and supported.

Laetare CMAT Updates

Year 8 Families - DfE Programme

The DfE are running an initiative called <u>Growing Up in the 2020s</u> and have informed us that one or more of our Year 8 students has been selected – though not provided details of who they are. This is a new national study of young people in England attending secondary school, and their families. By following young people and their families over time, the study aims to provide a contemporary understanding of how young people's school, home life and relationships shape their attainment, wellbeing, and post-16 destinations. The study focuses on the opportunities and challenges facing young people during an important time in their lives and when the effects of the pandemic are still being felt by some. Those involved will be contacted directly.

A PRAYER MOMENT

This week our focus has been on student-led Prayer and Liturgy and WOW did our students deliver! It is always so insightful to hear the opinions of our students and in response to the feedback that we received last term, our format of Prayer and Liturgy had a total re-vamp!

Form Time Prayer and Liturgy

To give some context, In England and Wales, the School Standards and Framework Act 1998 mandates that all maintained schools (including those in Catholic Multi-Academy Trusts) provide a daily act of collective worship. Under the guidance of our directory for prayer life, collective worship is now called Prayer and Liturgy.

The framework and our directory explains that prayer moments should be "wholly or mainly of a broadly Christian character," reflecting the traditions of Christian belief. We know that here in De La Salle we have people from a whole host of different faith traditions and beliefs and so our times of prayer make use of scripture in a way that is accessible to all, regardless of where you might be on your faith journey.

We're conscious that prayer in school might not be your topic of choice for conversation around the dinner table and so many students won't share the provision that is on offer to them in school. We wanted to take an opportunity to let you know exactly what our daily form time prayer looks like.

We have a different theme for our prayer each week (we always include this in our newsletter) an those themes are in line with the Liturgical year and are rooted in relevant scripture from Sunday's mass

Chaplaincy provide materials for form classes to use. Day 1 is always an introduction to the scripture, this scripture will be revisited throughout the week during form and in the year group Prayer and Liturgy. This is an opportunity for students to read the scripture and get a better understanding of the context and message. Every other day, there is a "worship YOUR way" prayer offered to classes. Here students can decide what form or style of prayer they'd like to try out and engage with. On our 'listen' day students have a choice to listen to a song related to the theme, to have some time in meditation with music, or to listen to the silence of their hearts. We have a day to 'learn', here students can read a 'social story' that shares a project or event that promotes Catholic Social Teaching and relates to our weekly theme, choose the 'in the world' slide

and learn more about a community around our world and how our weekly theme is relevant through a global lens, or they can explore our 'spotlight' section where we aim to highlight a student or member of staff in relation to the theme!

Finally we have a 'reflect' day when students get an option of; 'picture this' when we use an image as a stimulus for relevant and meaningful discussion, 'big question' an opportunity for students to ponder life's challenges, or 'personal reflection' giving students an opportunity to think more deeply about their lives in relation to our weekly theme.

Year Group Prayer and Liturgy!

Our re-vamp of Prayer and Liturgy included a new rota for leading year group prayer. We have also introduced an allocated time each week for year groups to gather for prayer as well as their usual slot for assembly.

On our rota we now have students leading this time of prayer. This week students from Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 have really impressed us with their unique take on Luke's Gospel and the meeting of Simeon and Anna. The students helped us to think about the things we're thankful for in our lives. More importantly, they challenged us to think about our social responsibility and how our brother and sisters in the world are not always in the position to be thankful for the things we're thankful for. Great work!

Our Next Theme

Next week is the fifth week of Ordinary Time. At this time of year we use the colour green within our displays and materials produced for times of prayer and liturgy. This colour is symbolic of growth and freshness. We use green to represent that our understanding of scripture, and our hope is always new, developing and fresh within our community.

The theme of our prayer and liturgy will be; Follow Me. Prayer will be lead by our Heads of Year. We are still looking at Luke's Gospel, but this time, we witness Jesus calling his first disciples.

We can't wait to see how our Heads of Year inspire us to be fishers of people!

Apprenticeships combine real work with training and study. You won't just study and gain new knowledge as an apprentice, you'll be putting what you learn straight into practice. They are **open to everyone**, of any age.

As an apprentice you'll:

- Train for the workplace.
- Get hands-on experience.
- Earn a salary and get the same rights as employees, including sick leave and holiday pay.
- Spend at least 20% of your working hours training or studying.
- Undertake ongoing assessments, including an end-point assessment.

It can take between one and six years to complete an apprenticeship, depending on:

- The apprenticeship you choose.
- Your apprenticeship level.
- Your previous experience.




