#### Whole School Focus - ASCL Conference

Today I am writing this ahead of the Association of School and College Conference which is in Liverpool. This is the annual conference of headteachers, CEOs, principals and senior leaders which takes place Friday and Saturday and every year manages to attract some really good and influential speakers.

This year is no exception, as the line-up includes:

- Bridget Phillipson (Secretary of State for education)
- Sir Martyn Oliver (Chief Inspector of Schools)
- Alistair Campbell (former Special Advisor to Tony Blair and political pundit)
- Prof Becky Francis (who is leading the current educational curriculum review)
- Sam freedman (former government educational advisor)
- Lewis Goodall (Political journalist)
- Google (sharing their ideas of the future of technology within education)

As I hinted at last week, education is going through a significant period of change with the way Ofsted inspects schools, how school performance will be measured and shared, and a complete review of the curriculum in England. The key people for all these areas will be part of the conference providing up to date input as to what the future might hold in education.

As well as these key speakers, there are dozens of workshops from which I have selected:

- Leading for SEND excellence in mainstream education
- Al for school and college leaders
- Internal Alternative Provision: principles and pitfalls of effective practice
- The balanced approach to dealing with classroom behaviour

Then of course there is the display market hall which contains row upon row of companies who provide various services and support for schools. In previous years this has led to me being able to bring back several new ideas and systems.

You can perform miracles by touching the hearts of those entrusted to your care.



The Friday runs 8am till 6pm and then on Saturday 8.30am through to 4.30pm. My hope is to have a much clearer idea of what the next 3-5 years in education is going to look like, to allow us to be well set as a school for when the current uncertainties subside.

#### **Bus Time Changes – 754 Morning Service**

We have been notified by Merseytravel of an upcoming minor change to bus times for the 754 in the mornings. This service will operate 10 minutes earlier (arriving at De La Salle approx. 0803), effective from **Monday 24 March 2025**. This is due to the service experiencing significant reliability issues on route, which are therefore causing it to arrive severely late to Rainford High School (the 754 continues on to Rainford High School after De La Salle). Unfortunately, to ensure that the service is able to run on time to both schools, the only option was to amend the departure time and add additional run time while on route.
