Whole School Focus – Running GCSE Exams

In the whole school focus I try to cover a wide range of topics about school life to help parents get a deeper understanding of what goes on in school, and with the main block of GCSE exams about to start, this week I wanted to lift the curtain on what goes in to managing GCSEs for 240 students. As I have mentioned at the start, Year 11 are about to begin their full GCSEs and our primary focus has been on preparing our Year 11 students for these final few weeks before the GCSEs start. As in previous years, every department has had detailed plans in place for what will be taught, to whom, by whom and when since before Christmas. As I say, however, I wanted to give you a bit of an insight into the actual process of running these important exams.

The main GCSE exam window opens on Monday 12th May. Running these exams is a mammoth task, led by our exams officer, Mrs Roughley and her team of invigilators. As well as the main large venue in the Sports Hall, we also need to operate a range of smaller venues for students with a range of additional needs including those who need extra time, require readers, require scribes or any other adaptations.

The level of planning and organisation required to not only make this happen, but for it to happen with the level of security and adherence to the very strict guidelines, is incredible. With every venue needing to be secure, have all the appropriate signage, seating arrangements and distances etc. It is also very demanding on staff time, requiring large numbers of exam invigilators. We are always on the lookout for new invigilators.

The exams will run most days from 12th May through to the end of June, with every day's completed exam papers needing to be sorted, bundled and dispatched to the appropriate marker or exam board. JCQ, who oversee the national GCSE exams, also build in addition contingency days to be used if there are any local or national emergencies that prevent any exams taking place.

Then when we get to June, we say goodbye to our Year 11 students and look ahead to the summer results and keep our fingers crossed!

You can perform miracles by touching the hearts of those entrusted to your care.

What's My Job?

This is a question I often ask myself! And this week our Year 7 students have been taking part in a series of careers-based workshops. These workshops have seen a range of visitors from a very varied range of professions and employments sectors, coming in to school. Students then get to ask questions about them and their roles in order to try and work out what jobs each of them do. Throughout the sessions, our students have been very positive and engaged, eager to work out who was who, whilst also looking to learn more about each profession and the realities of everyday life within those jobs.

Year 10 Mocks – A Great Start

I wanted to say a word of praise for our Year 10 students who started their mock exams this week. This is their first proper experience of the full exam venue and, usually, it takes a year group 2 or 3 exams before we have behaviour to the standard we expect. The Year 10s, however, have been excellent from the very start – so a big thank you to them, the Year team and you for ensuring they were ready and focused for these exams.

Sporting Updates:

Commiserations to our Year 11 Rugby Team. A phenomenal chapter draws to a close as Year 11 played their final game together at the TW Stadium. Losing in the Town Cup to a very strong Cowley side. We are proud of the boys' efforts this year and wish them the very best for their sporting futures. Tries from Rice and Allen and Player of the match was Kelsall.

Congratulations go to our U13 girls who beat Alder Grange to progress into the quarter finals of the National Cup. Another show of challenge and resilience saw the girls win 3-0 in the National Competition, A screamer from Sienna opened the scoring before Phoebe and Eden secured the victory.

Individual Student Success

We have had further success for our students outside of school:

- Holly Morris (Year 9): After a successful trial period at Everton, Holly has been offered a two-year contract with Everton U16s.
- Laila Turner's (Year 11) was asked to draw bespoke anatomical illustrations to show the complexity of congenital heart defects in a recent scientific paper. Staffing

As many parents will know, schools are experiencing considerable issues in recruiting staff, especially from subjects such as maths, science and DT. We have been very fortunate in having almost a full complement of staff all year. We have also been successful in our most recent appointments of science and cover supervisor staffing.

Alongside this, our staff absence levels are quite low compared to most schools. Nevertheless, we have had some staff absent for extended periods, most recently Mr Fletcher (PE), Mr Miller (DT) and Mrs Henshaw (English) – all for unavoidable and genuine reasons. We try hard to mitigate any impact of these absences on the students through re-allocation of existing staffing, changes to group sizes and structures and, where possible, getting suitable supply staff in. All 3 of our colleagues have either begun their return to school, or are about to, and we look forward to welcoming them back.
